Programs Initiated/Supported by the Hawai'i America250 Commission

The Hawai'i America250 Commission works to help people be aware of, interested in, and participating in the 250th anniversary programs on the founding of the United States.

- 2025-2026 Living the Aloha Spirit (#LivingTheAloha Spirit)
 - o This is a nationwide program initiated and sponsored by the Hawai'i America250 Commission.
 - o 250 years ago, the signers of the Declaration of Independence taught us vital lessons of personal responsibility, service, and sacrifice, with their mutual "pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes and our sacred Honor" to protect the "unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness".
 - As we contemplate and plan for the next 250 years, especially in a time of increasing polarization, we individually and collectively have the responsibility of working together to realize the aspirations that the framers committed to in the Charters of Freedom (Declaration of Independence, Constitution of the United States, and Bill of Rights).
 - We are asking others to join us by including the "Aloha Spirit" in how we move forward, wherever you live.
 - o As we look to the future and commit ourselves to making wherever we are a better place, we can learn from, reflect upon, and take actions in our community following the core principles of the Aloha Spirit: kindness, expressed with tenderness; unity, expressed with harmony; agreeable, expressed with pleasantness; humility, expressed with modesty; and patience, expressed with perseverance. (The Aloha Spirit is in Hawai'i State Law, §5-7.5 Hawai'i Revised Statutes.)
 - o "Spread a little Aloha around the World." (Mana'o Company) If we act with courtesy and caring (core to the Aloha Spirit), Hawai'i, America, and the World will be strengthened.
- 2025-2026 Flying the Flag in Color Guard Presentations and on Flag Poles (#FlyingTheFlag)
 - o This is a nationwide program initiated and sponsored by the Hawai'i America250 Commission.
 - This program encourages ROTC, JROTC, and other Color and Honor Guard units across the country to include the America250 flag alongside the US flag, to symbolize and acknowledge the ongoing commemoration of the 250th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence and the US.
 - The Commission arranged for availability of America250 flags for participating ROTC (colleges and universities) and JROTC (high schools) Color/Honor Guard units to have the America250 flags included at Color/Honor Guard presentations (at sporting events, school programs, parades,



2025-2026 - Moments That Made US

- o This is a nationwide program initiated by several of the Western States and supported by the Hawai'i America250 Commission.
- o Moments That Made US is a free, customizable, print-on-demand exhibition exploring the ideals at the heart of the Declaration of Independence through moments in our history that have defined their meaning. It does so in a user-friendly format that organizations can adapt and make their own.
- o The panels may be printed as posters, foam-core panels, or vinyl banners (in whatever size/scale one needs), or they can be used digitally.
- O All materials will be free to download, so the only cost is printing and mounting in your space, making it ideal for museums, libraries, schools, community spaces and anyone looking for a meaningful and affordable way to participate in America's 250th. Moments That Made US exhibition will be available for installation beginning in early 2026.



- October 7, 2025, 5 pm, Tues Ironman Triathlon World Championship Parade of Nations (Kona)
 - o 5 pm Marriott King Kamehameha's Kona Beach Resort (KBR) and proceed along Ali'i Drive to Hale Hālāwai - Athletes from around the world come together - representing their countries with pride, walking behind their flags. The Kealakehe High School JROTC Color Guard will lead the procession and include the America250 flag in their detail.
- October 11, 2025, Saturday Waimea Fall Festival (Hawai'i Island)
 - o This annual festival features games, food, military static displays, and plenty of family-friendly fun. The Signers of the Declaration of Independence video loop will be shown on a monitor.
- October 13, 2025, Monday 250th Anniversary of the Formation of Navy (October 13, 1775)
 - o The Hawai'i America 250 Commission has worked with the Mayors across the Islands, and each will present a Proclamation commemorating the Navy's 250th anniversary.



o Sojourn 250 is a global traveling flag campaign to honor our nation's most prized symbol, our Flag, and all of our men and women including those who have given their lives in service to the ideals The Flag represents. The Flag will fly over all 26 overseas US military cemeteries, then across the US.



o The Sojourn 250 flag is expected to be raised at the Pearl Harbor National Memorial and the National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific (on either October 16 or 17) in a series of flag raising ceremonies.

November 10, 2025, Mon - 250th Anniversary of the Formation of Marine Corps (Nov 10, 1775)

o The Hawai'i America 250 Commission has worked with the Mayors across the Islands, and each will present a Proclamation commemorating the Marine Corps' 250th anniversary.

- December 12, 2025, 1 pm, Friday Death of Captain John Kendrick (December 12, 1794)
 - o 1 pm The Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) are hosting an anniversary commemoration event recognizing American Revolutionary War Patriot Captain John Kendrick (who died in Honolulu on December 12, 1794) at the Kendrick historical marker at Walker Park (at the foot of Fort Street–mauka of Aloha Tower).
- April 2026 (Dates TBD), Sat and Sun Hawaiian Scottish Festival and Highland Games
 - \circ Typically, 9 am 4 pm, Sat and Sun, Sponsored by the Hawaiian Scottish Association
- Spring 2026 (Date TBD) A Conversation on Hawai'i in America and the World
 - o The Hawai'i America 250 Commission is partnering with the young adults of the Youth 250 Bureau and Made by Us (aged 18 to 30) to bring civics and history to dorm rooms, dinner tables, and devices, in a co-generational virtual event that Program will address the question: "What can we, as people from Hawai'i, do to better our society, our country, and the world?"
 - o Through a national Zoom gathering, there will be a brief panel presentation that will discuss what role Hawai'i has historically played in America and in the world.
 - o Then, in the main portion of the event, attendees will break into small groups to 'talk story' (have a conversation) amongst themselves and listen to each other share how they think Hawai'i should participate in the next 250 years of American history and what they can do to support that vision.
 - BY US o Just as the founders took responsibility for and committed themselves to service and sacrifice in defending and upholding their vision for the future, we hope to empower participants to imagine and take action to forge visions/actions of their own for the next 250 years.

• July 4, 2026, Sat, (based on 2 pm (EDT)) National Bell Festival-Ringing from Sea to Shining Sea

o The National Bell Festival invites bells and bell towers across America to ring out together at 2 pm (EDT) on July 4, 2026, creating a canopy of sound over our nation.

- O The National Bell Festival has established the U.S. Semiquincentennial Committee to plan the bell ringing contribution to our nation's 250th birthday. As in celebrations past, like the centennial of 1876 and the bicentennial of 1976, bells will feature prominently in community celebrations and national moments of commemoration.
- Reminiscent of the program initiated across the country for the nation's Bicentennial, Hawai'i is calling others to ring bells (replica Liberty Bell on the State Capitol grounds, Church bells, community bells, hand bells, cow bells, etc).



• July 4, 2026, Saturday - Parades and Events across the Islands Commemorating the 250th Anniversary of the Declaration of Independence

O The Hawai'i America250 Commission, Committees, and Commission and Committee members will seek participation/ inclusion of Hawai'i America250 representatives, banners, flags, and references in parade announcements in 4th of July (2026) parades across the islands.



• July 4, 2026, Saturday – Light to Unite – evening of July 4, 2026

The National Flag Foundation is planning a national event asking all cities in America to light up red, white, and blue the evening of July 4, 2026 as a national evening of unity to celebrate our nation's 250th Birthday. In Hawai'i, the initial focus is on State and County government buildings.



• July 5, 2026, Sunday - America's Potluck

- o This is a nationwide program in which Hawai'i is participating.
- America's Potluck is an opportunity for neighbors to join with one another to share a fun, communal meal, creating a sense of connection and belonging and fostering interactions among people from all walks of life.
- o 2026 marks the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence, the document that tied our nation together. The tradition of Sunday dinner invites us to slow down, serve others, and connect with one another. Through dialogue and

a shared meal, we can promote our common bonds and honor the freedoms we enjoy as Americans.

• July 8, 2026, Wed - Sharing the Spirit of America - (#SharingTheSpiritOfAmerica)

- o This is a nationwide program initiated and sponsored by the Hawai'i America250 Commission.
- O Just as the Declaration of Independence was read for the first time to the people in Philadelphia on July 8, 1776, now, 250-years later, Americans in all 50 States and 16 Territories of the United States will read the Declaration of Independence 'together' (based 6 pm (EDT) and your respective time zones). These readings will occur at State Capitols, City Halls, County and Municipal Buildings, Schools, Libraries, Community Centers, Parks, etc (including individual families sharing the words and vision of the Declaration of Independence in their own homes). • September 27, 2026, Sunday – 21st Annual Joint Memorial Service (Punchbowl)

- o The 21st Joint Memorial Service held at the National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific at Punchbowl is presented by the 100th Infantry Battalion Veterans (Club 100), 442nd Veterans Club, 442nd Legacy Center, Sons and Daughters of the 442nd Regimental Combat Team, and Military Intelligence Service Veterans Hawai'i organizations.
- o The veterans participate in an annual memorial service for their fallen comrades, on the Sunday in September closest to the anniversary of the date that the first member of the 100th Infantry Battalion, Sgt. Shigeo "Joe" Takata, was killed in action (September 29, 1943).

• December 7, 2026, Wed – Pearl Harbor Memorial Parade (Waikīkī)

- o 4:15 pm (HST) Opening Ceremony (Fort DeRussy); 6 pm (HST) Parade begins (Kalākaua Ave)
- December 7, 1941, "a date that will live in infamy" thrust the US into the 2nd World War. Now, 85 years later, Americans and people from all over the world gather to pay tribute to those whose service and sacrifice preserved freedom and liberty at home and abroad.



o A program of 'Historic Programs,' the Pearl Harbor Memorial Parade commemorates the anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor.

America Innovates: A traveling tech expo that will display America's greatest innovations as well as our aspirations for the future, asking the next generation of creators what innovations they want to create that will be critical for the next 250 years.

The Great American State Fair: In July 2026, Washington, D.C. will host a spectacular State Fair unlike any other. Every U.S. state and territory will bring its unique spirit, traditions, and pride to the capital, creating a dynamic celebration of our national heritage, innovation, and culture. It will be a vibrant showcase of the people and stories that make America extraordinary.

Time Capsule: A collaboration between America250, Library of Congress, National Institute of Standards and Technology, and the National Park Service to collect items for a time capsule to be installed at Independence National Historical Park in Philadelphia on July 4, 2026.

July 4th 2026 Activations: A national celebration in Washington, DC and across the country on July 4, 2026 in which we will partner with established groups who host legacy July 4th events as well as parade organizers at the state and local levels.
